

Most memorable experience — I was placed at a healthcare firm in Chennai and was to fly outside India. For some reason, my trip got delayed and I could attend the Convocation at IIM Trichy. I won 'Student of the Year Gold medal' and Mr. Birla who was the Chief Guest at our Convocation, while presenting the Gold medal, made me an offer to join the Aditya Birla Group on the stage. It is a moment I am really proud of but seldom do I talk about it at Aditya Birla Group. I wish to grow because of the value I add and not because I was selected by the Chairman.

My current role at ABG — The strength of our Group has been manufacturing and operational excellence. But as the world changes rapidly and threats come from seemingly unrelated quarters (did you know Alibaba went from not being a Financial Services player to the largest fund in the World in less than 5 years), ABG has embarked on an ambitious journey of putting Consumer and Innovation at the Centre of what we do. We have set up a structured process of getting feedback from our Customers, value-chain as well as end Consumers that becomes an strong insights engine. This feedback is then routed using a strong Technology backbone to the relevant teams for them to action on it. The key learning for me has been how does one get people across the organization excited about this mission so that it becomes a way of life.

2 years at IIMT — It was hectic, as a Placement committee member, to juggle between academics and extracurriculars. I think there are two things that helped on this journey and I continue to follow this even today. First is set aside time to take care of your health because in your career you prepare to be a Marathon runner not a Sprinter. My choice is outdoor exercise (running, swimming, cycling, hiking, etc.) and you could make your own choice but the critical aspect is to not compromise on this discipline. Second is cut down on superfluous activities that eat into our time and more importantly attention. Some simple steps like prioritizing tasks, starting your day with the toughest job of the day, switching on your mobile data only once I two hours (do try this; it works) go a long way in taking control of your time.

Clubs and committees – I think this is the core of how Management education is different from Technical education. These activities will not only help you develop the soft skills I referred to above, but also develop these areas as your Passion. Because you want to be going to work because you LOVE what you do.

A word to Juniors – Two specific points; Point 1 please refrain from bucketing yourself as a 'I am a Marketing Guy', 'I am a Finance Guy'. I haven't seen a single Business leader who doesn't understand and appreciate all the pillars of Business. In fact, the Marketing Leaders that grow are good at Finance and vice versa. Point 2 focus on building softer aspects (Working in large multifunctional teams, motivating team-members, networking outside work, facilitation skills, influencing, building presence) as much if not more than Functional knowledge.

"IIM T was homecoming for me as I studied in NIT Trichy. I was also lucky to have an amazing peer group, seniors and professors. It couldn't have been any better than this. Learning about the different perspectives of different people was the most valuable experience of campus life.

I had my share of fun. The best experiences were the preparation for various events. The BTS fun, I still distinctly remember the gala that we had preparing for Sanskriti. Classes too were interesting. I still remember our first class was taken by Prof V. Gopal. It was a lively class for many reasons and the exams as well were special. Even the CAs were like "Dude, what happened in the paper?" This set the tone for the next two years.

Along with this we had a lot to learn too. Along with the curriculum, what really shaped me were the experiences of working in a team and creating an amazing final deliverable for projects and competitions. Being in the Placement team helped me develop my people and time management skills. These learnings stay with you forever.
